

Intimate Partner Abuse Education Program 3-DAY INTENSIVE TRAINING

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This course is designed for those who are concerned about domestic violence and men who abuse. Participants will learn intervention strategies, philosophies and approaches consistent with the "Duluth Model" that meet the Intimate Partner Abuse Education Program (IPAEP) Certification requirements of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and **meet all Department of Public Health 2015 revised standards and requirements for group facilitator training.** Although not everyone who participates in this training will go on to work with abusive men, this training, **along with six group observations**, is a pre-requisite to work in a certified program.
